A Christmas Message

The season of Advent is a season of reflection, once kept with a similar strictness as Lent, without the fasting. This time of year places us in some conflict with the secular Christmas, with Santas, parties, planning for holidays and all the excitement of the season.

Advent as the name suggests comes from the Latin 'Adventus which means the coming, or the arrival. In this instance it is about the arrival of Jesus. During this season we reflect on His coming as a babe in Bethlehem over two thousand years ago, of the preparation made for his birth but then we are projected to Jesus arrival as the Messiah with the words of John the Baptist ... prepare the way for the Lord. Further we are challenged to direct our attention to the promised return of Christ at the end of the age.

Whichever the coming, the preparation is the same. It is a time when we need to be spiritually ready to encounter God's revelation of himself. To refocus and commit ourselves afresh to looking for the signs of His presence, to embrace them, so that we might be spiritually prepared.

Advent is a time of new beginnings: 'It is the start of a new liturgical year, we meet a God who is the God of the impossible with images of transformation and hope. It is the season of the impossible becoming possible. In the scriptures we read of the dry, barren wilderness bursting into bloom; of broken hearts healing; of a barren woman and a young virgin both conceiving children. It is the season of longing and light'

As we enter the Christmas season we can do so, amid all the secular trimmings, with a sense of hope that God can make all things new. We can rejoice that the giftedness of God continues in our world, that transformation is possible. The gift of the new born babe in Bethlehem kindles within us the hope that there can be a better world. All we need do is be alert, and trust God at his word.

May you each enjoy a happy and holy Christmas rejoicing in God's gift of love: of the Word made flesh. Fr. Jim.
