At 11:30am this Sunday, 19 July, we will have our first baptism since lockdown restrictions were eased – Thomas Laverick. Please pray for Thomas and his family on this special occasion

Under the heading "Boast About GOD", I was directed to Psalm 34:2 – "My soul will make its boast in the LORD."

When we feel afraid, we may be prone to pulling the blanket over our heads, hoping whatever "it" is, will go away. Or we nurse our fears. The adversary of our souls loves to get our attention focussed on ourselves and not on the resources of GOD.

What will happen when we praise and worship GOD? Our praise makes GOD big in heart and mind. Soon, our problem falls into perspective. When we worship GOD, sometimes with even tears rolling down our faces, our spirit is renewed as we praise GOD. The problem does not go away, but all of a sudden, we see it in relation to the One who is in charge of everything.

It's interesting what we boast about, isn't it? At the last function we attended – seems so far back in time due to COVID-19 – what did you boast about? Why not put the spotlight on the LORD and focus on Him? When we get together with friends, let's brag about JESUS. So many good things are happening in our lives as individuals, in our families, and in our church that we ought to boast on the LORD all the time.
