Under the heading "**Joy In The Morning**", I was directed to Psalm 30:5 – "Weeping may endure for a night, but joy comes in the morning."

It's interesting that David follows a pattern of looking at the day that was begun in the creation account in Genesis. He says that weeping comes in the night, but joy comes in the morning. If you remember, when GOD created the heavens and the earth, He said, "The evening and the morning were the first day." (Genesis 1:5). We tend to think just the opposite, don't we? We think of morning followed by the evening.

I think there are wonderful truths embedded in GOD's perspective on life. If we will look at our day as the evening and the morning instead of the morning and the evening, we will begin our day in the evening by meditating on what we need to accomplish the next day and asking GOD's blessing on it. Then He is free to work in our heart and mind as we sleep to prepare us for accomplishing those things. When CHRIST returns there will be no more weeping. Weeping is ours during the night; but our eternal joy is coming in the morning of CHRIST's return.
