Parish Council met online during the week using Zoom. It was wonderful to have Ann Dendle join us in the midst of all her treatment. The "Job-Keeper" subsidy has provided the Parish with financial assistance as we journey through this pandemic.

Our Kinship Group is continuing to find new ways to keep in touch while they are not able to meet in person. Heather Barbour and Christine Gannon support the grandparents through phone calls and informal "catchups" for coffee where possible. Please continue to pray for Heather as she recovers from being struck by a car on the pedestrian crossing in William Street near Market Place, the Mutual Bank and Terry White Chemist – thankfully, no broken bones.

It is still important that we wear masks when we come to St John's. COVID-19 is still casting its shadow over us and we must all continue our diligence in following the health regulations issued by the relevant authorities. Wearing masks is just one of these – hand hygiene and sanitising and keeping physical distance from each other is still important, too. There are signs up around the Church building and regular hand sanitising stations to assist.

On Sunday 23 August, Bishop Sonia will be visiting us. She will meet with Parish Council after the service for a short time. Lynn has featured Bishop Sonia this week in our Pew Sheet.

During the month of September, we will again be holding our **Seasons of Creation** services. It will begin on Sunday 6 September. Under the heading "Are You A Learner?", I was directed to Acts 11:26 – "The Disciples were first called Christians at Antioch"

We're prone to think of disciples as "turbo-charged" Christians – but originally, the terms *disciple* and *Christian* were synonymous. Differentiating between the two has had the effect of watering down the original demands of following CHRIST.

Theologian Dallas Willard puts it this way: "The word *disciple* occurs 269 times in the New Testament. *Christian* is found 3 times; and was first introduced to refer precisely to the disciples. The disciple of JESUS is not the deluxe or heavy-duty model of the Christian – especially padded, textured, streamlined, and empowered for the fast-lane of the straight and narrow way. He stands on the pages of the New Testament as the first level of basic transportation in the Kingdom of GOD."

Modern Christians don't often think of using the term *disciple* to describe themselves; but JESUS never put the terms of discipleship in small print. He's not content for us to be distant followers – and He will not rest until we learn to take His yoke upon us and learn from Him (Matthew 11:29).

The word *disciple* means learner – and it refers to someone who is committed to learning to live the CHRIST-life in conscious, daily obedience. Is that you?
